BRYSON ISD TRANSFER CONTRACT

Bryson ISD, in this contract, outlines conditions in which the district will accept out of district transfers. In the contract, there are also conditions outlined which will have to be met and maintained for the transfer student to remain in the Bryson district. The transfer will not be affected by any discriminatory acts as to race, sex, religion, or national origin.

Conditions of the following contract must be signed in agreement before transfer procedures will be processed.

Conditions for transfer:

- 1 Transfer student and a parent or legal guardian will be interviewed by a Bryson administrator.
- 2 All records must be available upon request of Bryson ISD.
- 3 All STAAR test scores must meet the standards set by Bryson ISD.
- 4 Transfer student must be on grade level, or his or her situation must be approved by Bryson ISD before transfer is accepted.
- 5 A background check concerning student disciplinary status, attendance, and academic record, will be conducted.
- 6 This contract is set up for individuals on a year to year basis only. Siblings or other relatives must be done separately.
- 7 Transfer contract must be renewed each year.
- 8 Transfer may be revoked at any time discussed in the contract if "acceptable" levels of behavior are not maintained.
- 9 Revocation of the transfer may take place at the end of a 6 weeks grading period for academics, or at the time a disciplinary problem occurs.
- 10 Parents will be notified and a meeting scheduled prior to revocation of transfer.

Bryson ISD sets the following "acceptable" levels of behavior

- Student discipline shall be followed as outlined in the **Student Handbook** and **Code of Conduct.**Should the disciplinary matter become persistent, revocation of the transfer will take place.
- 2 Student attendance will be monitored, and at any time attendance becomes a persistent problem, revocation of the transfer may take place.
- 3 Student academics will be closely monitored, and at the end of any 6 weeks grading period if the transfer student is failing more than 1 subject, the transfer may be revoked.
- 4 If at any time Bryson ISD is notified, and can prove that the transfer student has been charged or indicted with an offense punishable by an arrest from law enforcement officials, Bryson ISD may revoke the transfer immediately.
